The next International Encounter of the Freudian Field, the fifth such encounter since 1980, will be held July 13th to 16th, 1988 in Buenos Aires.

Like those which preceded it, this Encounter will involve important work in the development of a psychoanalytic clinic. Following upon our 1986 theme "Hysteria and Obsession," we have chosen the following topic for Buenos Aires: "A Differential Clinic of the Psychoses".

For the Encounter, a several hundred page volume will be published containing reports on work done concerning this subject by groups the world over, usually basing their research on that of Jacques Lacan. This volume will be published in Spanish and French and sent to each of the Encounter's participants.

of the Encounter will provide the first international panorama of Lacanian-oriented research on psychosis.

The 1988 Encounter is being organized by the *Fundacion del Campo Freudiano* in Argentina, where a commission is handling the registration of Spanish-speaking South Americans.
